SWIM LESSONS

Swim lessons for children will begin on July 3rd at Harris Park Beach. Kelly Lyndacker is the Waterfront Director and will be supervising the program.

Lessons: Monday thru Thursday with Friday as a make-up for rainouts. Lessons start at 9:30am and end at 11:30am. There will be 3(three), 2(two) week sessions with each session lasting 30 minutes. More experienced swimmers will be in the early groups and beginning swimmers in the latter groups.
