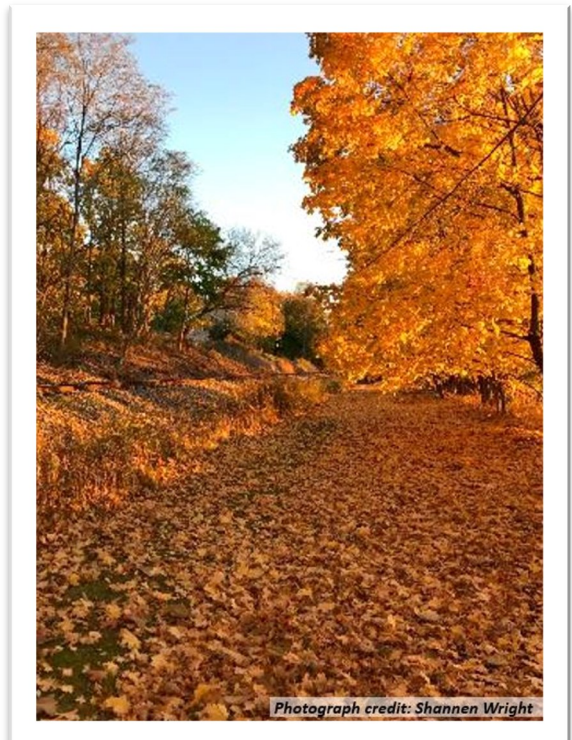

Installing a Solid Fuel burning stove, furnace or boiler?

Don't risk insurance cancellation or coverage

Get a permit from the Village Office or online at www.villagecayugany.com. This will include inspection and a Certificate of Compliance when installed to manufacturers installation instructions for that appliance.

This also applies when replacing a Solid fuel stove, furnace or boiler to assure the existing vent, clearances and specifications meet your application.

Fall Clean-Up

Brush and leaf collection will continue the 1st and 3rd Wednesday thru November. In October, the Village's leaf vacuum will be active until November 15th. Please rake your leaves to the side of the road during those dates and leaves will be picked up. **Do Not** rake into culverts or ditches! After November 15th, leaves must be bagged in environmentally safe bags and left at curbside for pick-up.

New York State regulation does not allow burning inside Village limits.

A Household Hazardous Waste event has been scheduled for October 21st. Gather your leftover chemicals, poisons, gas/oil mixes, fluorescent lights, propane tanks and more and register to bring them to the event. You must register to participate. Call Cornell Cooperative Extension at 315-255-1183, extension 238 to register. Upon registering, you will be told where the event is being held and an entrance ticket will be sent to you. Fire Prevention Week

October 8-12

*"Every second counts,
Plan to have two ways out!"*

You only have 2 minutes to exit a house

- * Install and maintain smoke and carbon monoxide alarms outside every sleeping area and on every level of your home. Change batteries annually. Replace alarms per instructions.
- * Keep flammable items at least 3 feet from portable heaters or lit candles.
- * Do Not use any appliance with frayed wires
- * Use only electric blankets certified by a testing lab such as UL, CSA, or ETL
- * Blankets or spreads should not be on top of electric blankets when in use. Pets should never sleep on an electric blanket.

Facts on Cause and Fatalities

- * Cooking equipment-leading cause of home structure fires.
- * Smoking leading cause of civilian home fire deaths
- * Heating equipment is 2nd most common cause of home fire fatalities.
